Daily I get a couple of devotionals in my email, although for most of them I am not quite sure how they got started. I probably googled something and these popped up as suggestions. I then liked that first one, and signed up..... a happy

coincidence, because for the most part they are good, and help me to get my day started.

Right now I am focusing on a site called iBelieve.com and am following an article titled "30 Day Prayer Challenge for Stress and Anxiety"*. The article begins: This past year has been one of the most rapidly changing, chaotic periods many of us have ever experienced. When life's uncertainties threaten to steal our inner calm, may we draw close to the Prince of Peace, and may His peace, which surpasses understanding, sink deep into our souls, expelling our inner angst. This 30-day anti-anxiety prayer challenge will fasten our hearts in Christ and His unshakable, never-changing truths—promises strong enough to carry us through our greatest difficulties. Make the prayers below your own, whether that means saying every word or using each day's focus as a prompt.

I am on day 8, and this mornings reading was:

Day 8: Help me recognize what's false.

"Guide me in Your truth and teach me, for You are God my Savior, and my hope is in You all day long." (**Psalm 25:5**)

My fears are so deceptive, God. They tell me the problems in front of me are greater than the God that dwells within me, stands beside me, and surrounds me. They trick me into believing a virus or health concern has authority over life and

death, when I know that power solely belongs to You. My anxiety says my financial security lies in the job market, my paycheck, or my savings account, instead of the God who always provides. I know You remain sovereign over all, but sometimes, I forget. Unfortunately, there are days when I give more authority to the noise all around me than the steady and faithful voice of my God within. I need Your help. Close my ears, Lord, to everything contradictory to You. May Your voice ring the loudest, for I know You always speak truth. Your words always lead to peace and increased freedom.

I needed to hear that this morning.... in the midst of internet and parking lot worship, in this age of "social distancing". In a day where, when people are in the hospital or nursing home or even in their homes, we still need to keep our distance. I see people getting "edgy" and many becoming short tempered (in my neighborhood and, according to reports, all across the nation). We are a people of community, and yet are warned to keep a safe distance. The baseball season has begun, yet there are no fans (and today I heard of a team where a good number of players / staff are now infected). Thankfully now at SUMC we are somewhat able to gather in our parking lot for worship on Sunday and Wednesday, and just yesterday we finally finished our 2020 Lenten study, but we all know that it still isn't quite the same... no handshakes- no hugs. And to be truthful, my favorite part of the Sunday service is when you all are leaving.... and as I direct traffic I get to see you a little up close and share little with you.... and pray personally with you. Things are not the same.... and then I get the message about recognizing what's false. There is a lot of falsehoods going on these days. There are twisted truths and going ons throughout the world... in the news, in our neighborhoods.... and now the political season, with all of it's trash talking is about (has already) begun. The other day I was speaking with Betty in the office and said that I noticed that day a lot more "signs" were going up, and I shuttered for I know along with the signs comes the political rhetoric. With all of this I think back to Rodney King's statement in 1992... can't we all just get along?

And then it flares up "My fears are so deceptive, God. They tell me the problems in front of me are greater than the God that dwells within me, stands beside me, and surrounds me. They trick me into believing a virus or health concern has authority over life and death, when I know that power solely belongs to You... My anxiety says my financial security lies in the job market, my paycheck, or my savings account, instead of the God who always provides.

My prayer for each of us is from Psalm 25:5 "Guide me in Your truth and teach me, for You are God my Savior, and my hope is in You all day long.

notified, but please give what you can and keep the Samaritan Purse Operation



Some Thoughts from Betty

The **definition** of a **gossip** is someone who reveals personal information about others. A friend who passes on the secrets of other friends, but asks you not to tell is an example of a **gossip**. **Gossip** is **defined** as the private information about others shared in conversation or print.

Similar words are tattle tale, whispers, stories or tales.

The Ninth Commandment:

"Thou shalt not bear false witness" forbids: "1. Speaking falsely in any matter, lying, equivocating, and any way devising and designing to deceive our **neighbor**. ... Speaking unjustly **against** our **neighbor**, to the prejudice of his reputation; and (which involves the guilty of both).

Looks like the word Gossip and the Ninth Commandment have something in common.

Let's break it down into a few common words—Passes on secrets, Private information. Speaking falsely about someone. Speaking unjustly. Can hurt a persons reputation.

Yes! We have all gossiped or had bear false witness. Unless you are free of sin we all have done this one time or another in our lives. It might have been in passing, in a group setting or one on one. But in reality we have. No it's not good and we should all strive not too.

It's nice to have someone you can confide in, but I have learned you can't confide in most people so you really do have to be careful in what you say. I am not exempt from this in anyway and you aren't either. To me sin is black and white, either it is or it's not. But gossip is a slippery slope. You might honestly think you are speaking of a problem about someone and hoping to see things a bit clearer or even fix the problem. But then someone else might not see it that way. I guess God know what's in your heart and that is what really matters. But you and I should both be aware of hurt or judgments you might pass on others by your words.

We all need to cling to the 10 Commandments at all times in our walk with God.

I would like you to look this up, I typed in The Book of Discipline Gossip and this is what came up. *Book of Discipline* 2000, ¶103, p. 73

Conclusion:

Ultimately, the work of "doing no harm" is about "doing something" — modeling a way of being Christian in the world. Our behaviors carry as much impact as our words, if not more. How we treat one another is a significant act of leadership.

We wish our world to be a better place — a kinder, gentler world where decency, kindness, and consideration are the norm. Building such a reality is not simply about doing good things, but also about refraining from those things that harm, that reduce, that destroy. Nothing is lost to us when we refrain from gossip. We are not made better by putting other people down. We are not made stronger when we react to rumor as if it were true. Being disrespectful doesn't make us superior to anyone. And hiding our true feelings and allowing resentment to build cannot help but hurt us as well as others.

The less we engage in activities with the potential to do harm, the more we will be freed to engage in activities that build up. As leaders, we have the opportunity to point the way to a better way of living, of sharing, and of being the body of Christ.

Now this talks about Leaders, and if we are Christians, we are leaders. We are trying to lead people to Christ so we have to be diligent and not fall down the slippery slope.



Bible Lessons About Gossip

<u>Ephesians 4:29</u>: Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers.

<u>Leviticus 19:16</u>: Thou shalt not go up and down as a talebearer among thy people: neither shalt thou stand against the blood of thy neighbor; I am the LORD.

Matthew 7:1: Judge not, that ye be not judged.

Matthew 7:12: Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

<u>Proverbs 11:13</u>: A talebearer revealeth secrets: but he that is of a faithful spirit concealeth the matter.

<u>Proverbs 18:8</u>: The words of a talebearer are as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.

<u>Proverbs 26:20</u>: Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.

Romans 2:1: Therefore thou art inexcusable, O man, whosoever thou art that judgest: for wherein thou judgest another, thou condemnest thyself; for thou that judgest doest the same things.

<u>Timothy 1:13</u>: And withal they learn to be idle, wandering about from house to house; and not only idle, but tattlers also and busybodies, speaking things which they ought not
