


THINGS TO COME... MAYBE

In the next few weeks we may be trying some new things here at Saybrook United Methodist.....

First, we have received word (as of now) that Saybrook TWP Park will not be opened this summer for our outdoor worship service. This grieves most of us as we will be deprived of this annual mission ministry, where we tear down our walls while inviting those living and visiting in the Saybrook area to join with us in this, our non-threatening manner of friendship and worship, all as we celebrate God's beauty by our lakeshore.

In lieu of this, plans are being made to worship, together, outside, in a new manner.

By June 1 we hope to have an FM transmitter which will allow us to broadcast from either our "back porch" or the Gazebo. With the transmitter you will be able to stay in your cars, "see" one another, and listen to the service on your car radio, all while sitting in our parking lot. We also plan on having our summer speakers in place so you may, at a safe distance, with masks on, sit in lawn chairs near the gazebo, or outside of your cars. As we do at the lake, this will take place rain or shine. And do not fear, we will still be broadcasting our Sunday service on line.

Another thought is to again offer our weekly Taize service AND/OR a time of quiet meditation in our Sanctuary. Details are still being worked out, but the pews have already been marked on where to and not to sit. Communion will also always be served with the elements being offered in covered sealed containers.

We, in the next few weeks will be trying "something new" for as of now things are not yet back to "normal", but it is our desire to offer something spiritually meaningful, with a bit of fellowship, and a lot safety.

Again, be safe, and trust in your God who loves you more than you can humanly know, and who desires more than anything to be in that perfect relationship with you and all of His children.







Our Service




