


Pray for them, do what you can to help them invite Jesus into their lives, and assure them that with him all things will work for good... for those who know and love the Lord.

Mother Earth hanging together in the universe is not a coincidence! God had it all planned out from the very beginning. It truly is amazing! Everything is connected. The Earth stays in balance because of it's connection with the Universe. Without trees we would not have oxegen. Plants live because of the earth sun and rain. Plants produce vegetables and fruit and we eat the veggies and fruit. Insects have a purpose, they normally don't over populate because certain insects eat other insects. Reptiles such as frogs and even some plants eat insects for their own survival.

Genesis 2:15 "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and keep it." God gave man the job of keeping the earth clean and up to snuff.

We have so many animals, insects and plants that have become extinct because of our own wants and needs. Not only is it a sin but we cannot survive much longer on this earth if we keep destroying our own home! We ask ourselves what we can do? There are many things we can do to relieve our earth from our carbon foot print. From recycling to planting trees, finding alternative energy and yes, even planting Milk Weed to keep the Monarch butterflies from becoming extinct.

We found this to be true here at the church.

Milk weed was planted a few years back and the reason we planted it was because the Monarch Butterfly is an obligate feeder on milkweed. Monarchs always lay their eggs on the milkweed plant, and the larvae only develop on various species of this particular plant. The Milkweed is becoming extinct and in turn the Monarch Butterflies are in danger of becoming extinct.

I was fortunate to pick the pods off the Milk Weed and take them to the Jefferson Extension where the Pods are collected, then they are taken to the woods and planted.

It did my heart good this year to see all the Monarch Butterflies on the Milk Weed that we planted. I haven't seen that many Monarchs since I was a kid. I pray that we all keep trying a little harder to take care of the wonderful planet that we call home.

Besides, God means business, this is what the Bible tells us. In Rev. 11:18 it says... ¹⁸ The nations were angry, and your wrath has come. The time has come for judging the dead, and for rewarding your servants the prophets and your people who revere your name, both great and small and for destroying those who destroy the earth."
