

It does seem that our lives are flooded with reminders, or at least mine is..... Oh by the way, don't forget, at the end of this month we will be dedicating our 2022 Intention of Giving cards concerning your ministry of Prayers, Presence, Gifts, Service, and Witness. Back to reminders, So while I was thinking of reminders I thought I would go to my favorite office assistant (next to Betty) Google, and see what the Bible might say about Reminders..... Here is a short list of what I found:

Now this is just the short list, at the top of the page it said *About 28,300,000 results (0.58 seconds)*. Now I figured you didn't want the whole list 28,300,000 results, and truthfully we probably don't have space for all of them, but the opening scriptures for this message were the first six from the 99 verses that will remind you.....

Reminders, They are all around us. Sometimes they are blatant, sometimes they are snuck into other messages. Sometimes they are important, like a loved one's birthday.... Or your anniversary. 

The lowly shepherds were given the fresh and exciting news of the birth of a baby which they would find lying in a manger. When the angel appeared to them in the fields at night, a glory shown all around! This is a profound thought...light abounding all around them ...they could see each other as well as the Angel! The light had to catch their attention...as well as the voice of the Angel! In fact they were scared!!.

Somehow, we skip over that part of the story...showing the baby in the manger where cows are chewing their cud, sheep are huddling and there is a general shuffling movement all around the stable. Mary and Joseph must have had a lot to talk about...having this prophesy fulfilled in such humble surroundings. Even the animals were hushed as they moved about. An awareness of the power of God had them awed...knowing this was not a natural experience....wondering what else might come about!

Unless we put ourselves into the story...hear the sounds, smell the hay, sense the divine light overshadowing their space in the stable and ponder the scene with sincere humility...how can we really experience Christmas? A baby boy is lying there in the manger...An Angel had told Mary the baby would be named Jesus and Scripture tells us that Mary kept all these things in her heart!

When we stand near the creche...looking at the scene of Mary, Joseph and the baby...what are our thoughts? How long will we stay there...pondering the issue? Would we be mesermized...unable to move while we explain this part of the story to others who are nearby? Or are we unable to discuss the story...walking away ...leaving the story untold.

In some crèches the shepherds are standing within the light of heaven shining down upon the scene. If no one tells the story about shepherds, of what it all means, how can Christmas be of any significance? We would be buying, giving and enjoying the holiday music without any depth of interpretation of how God works among the people.

The good feelings about Christmas are all tied up with ribbons and bows...the pageants are seen and the children go to bed (having been good all year). They put out milk and cookies for Santa and then, hurriedly, slip into bed...hoping they might hear the reindeer hooves on the roof.

Blessed are the homes where Christ is the center of thought during this season. The season comes and goes...good cheer, friends and presents all are memories now. But the babe in the manger grows up and our Christian holidays carry that message. Yet, the Holy Spirit remains among us, teaching the hearts, which are opened, to learn about Love!
