- 1 Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him.
- 2 Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen.
- 3 And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?"
- 4 But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large.
- 5 And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed.
- 6 But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him.
- 7 But go, tell His disciples—and Peter—that He is going [a]before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you.

The Great Commission

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been

given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

On March 6th it was announced that I was retiring from full time Pastoral ministry. Following the announcement I heard tears (a lot of them were mine....), various words of concern, some words of anger or frustration, some surprise..... To say the least there was a lot of emotion on that Sunday morning. As I write this I know that there will be another announcement made this Sunday (March 27). Maybe, as you read this, it will have already been made, of who the new Pastor of the Saybrook / Plymouth charge will be. We are in a period of transition. Transitions are met with a variety of emotions. At times there is joy. With Jesus, there was joy at his passing, from his opponents, that now he is finally out of their way. But at the same time there were his followers who were grieving their loss. But both groups also faced a time of uncertainty. What now? What is the future about to hold?

It is the Lenten season and a time of personal, and I believe corporate reflection. It is a time to look and see who we really are as followers of Christ.... In the early Church it was a time for the new converts to prepare for their baptism and their entrance into the church. It is a time to prepare for Easter and the celebration of New Life, in Christ.

The scripture above takes place after the pain of Good Friday and the Crucifixion. It takes place after the pain and confusion of Black Saturday. And after the Joy and Celebration of Easter..... But it also brings about another confusion.... Jesus is alive, and we have so much Easter hope through Him..... but now here comes another transition..... He is leaving again, and this time with a Commissioning. GO, Make Disciples, Baptize, Teach....

and remembering that He goes with you. Remembering to keep the main thing the main thing.

In the next few months things around the Saybrook and Plymouth churches will be changing. You will have a new Pastor who WILL do things differently. Shoot, your current Pastor will probably do a few things differently..... BUT Jesus will still be Jesus..... And He will still expect you to GO, Make Disciples..... And He will never leave you..... So, Get to know him personally.

And as I preached a few weeks ago to the Girl Scouts, don't get to know him just through what your Pastor says, or a Lay Leader, or a Parent, or someone who thinks they know Him.... Get to know Him on a personal level! Speak to those others, but get to know him for yourself, on a very personal level. Read, Pray, Go to Church, Pray some More.

And remember, just as He said to his followers back then, He still says to you today.....

"And surely I am with you always, (even) to the very end of the age."
