#### Dear Friends,

My words come together with Thanksgiving leftovers still calling out to me and my thoughts go well beyond Christmas and on into New Years. Just as thankfulness reaches far beyond Thanksgiving, the Christmas story reaches far beyond Bethlehem's manger.

As a child, youth and even as a young adult, I gave very little thought to this season we find ourselves in called Advent, defined as the "Season of Preparation." On occasion I will think back on events or aspects of life. One such example could be the birth of our first child. All those many years ago we thought we were all prepared, our child was due in mid February, Karen's water broke and the plan of action began. The only problem was the sitter we had lined up to watch the three foster children never heard the phone ring. Thankfully a neighbor came to our rescue and off we went to a hospital an hour away in a snowstorm. Evan was born healthy but jaundiced, Karen was released in two days but not our child. In time we were told he would need a blood transfusion, which sent us rushing off to Cleveland. Thankfully prayers were answered, Evan was fine, all chalked up to a small hospital mis-diagnosis. Three and six years later our two daughters, both born in December, well into Advent, "The Season of Preparation."

I wonder what thoughts come to your mind when you think of the birth of Jesus, Advent, and this sense of preparing ourselves once again to receive the Christ Child. Possibly like many your thoughts run along the lines of a tiny baby boy, in a manger, with adoring parents at his side as well as all the other characters of the modern day image of the nativity scene.

The truth is, when God sent His Son into the world, the scene was far less inviting. Mary's birthing room was a stall hurriedly cleaned out, with nothing more than armfuls of hay tossed upon the floor. How Mary's heart must have dropped when Joseph led her into the dark and dingy place, as she knew she

was about to deliver the Savior. Soon, she would know that the crude animal's eating trough was to be the cradle to hold the Lord of Lords, King of Kings. It could not have made sense from Mary's point of view or ours, but from God's perspective it was perfect. Each year we are given these precious moments to stand in amazement at His personal love for us.

This is the joy of heaven come down. We see John 3:16 in a new way. For God so loved us that he came as a baby so that he could live and walk among us. The central message of Christmas is that through His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, we can have eternal life, joy, & peace.

As Christians, our entire life, who we are and what we do, needs to be caught up in the person of Jesus Christ. By right, He could come as a mighty King demanding our submission, but He came as a man seeking our love and devotion. We have the gift of the Immanuel (God with us). Let us each give gifts of love in return. When we walk with Jesus we are in the company of perfect love. When we claim Him as our own, we begin to see ourselves as God does, objects of His love.

Consider that you and I are objects of the love of the one eternal, creator and redeeming God. His greatness and His best, He desires to give to us, His Son Jesus Christ. If this Advent/Christmas season you have never said YES to Jesus and His offer of salvation, I pray that you do so now. Acts 4:10-12 states, "there is no other name under heaven by which we are to be saved than the name of Jesus." Why not give Jesus the gift of your total self? It is both Karen and my deepest desire for you and yours to experience afresh and anew, the unconditional love of our Lord and Savior this Christmas.

May all the joy of a Christ filled Christmas be yours!



Chairperson's Note:

#### No Room In The Tent

When my wife and I were newly married, we bought a three person tent. We thought that it would give us plenty of room for our twin size air mattress and our stuff. The first time we went camping, we were really surprised. Our twin air mattress went from wall to wall in the tent. There was no room for our things, and certainly would not have had room for a third person. Even without the air mattress, I don't have any idea how three people could have fit in there. We kept all our things in the car and couldn't help but feel like we were sold a bill of goods. What was promoted as being a big enough tent, really wasn't. I fear that is becoming the story of the United Methodist Church and it breaks my heart.

We are being told again and again that there is room for all in this Big Tent called the United Methodist Church. There is plenty of room under the canvas for Progressives, Centrist, and Conservatives (Traditional Christians) alike. We can all live together in harmony as long as we give one another permission to live as we choose. I'm just not seeing it. We seem to be putting up a tent just big enough for Progressives and Centrists, but the Traditional Christians have to sleep in the car.

This is not surprising, because the ground cloth of Pluralism has never been a good base for a tent. I have heard Seminary Professors, Church officials, and Bishops say for 35 years that we are not a doctrinal church. The Bishops keep quoting that we have Articles of Religion, but for decades, many have chosen not to acknowledge or uphold them. If Pluralism (Big Tent) theology is your base, friends, every time it rains, water is going to come into the tent.

The lack of room under canvas for Traditional Christians was not only on display, it was flaunted and celebrated in the recent Jurisdictional Conferences. I watched what I could of our North Central Jurisdiction on line and I have read about the others. Let me share some of the things that were done to marginalize or keep more traditional believers out of the tent.

There were 13 Bishops elected in the United States. To the best of our understanding, none of them are Traditional in their theology. The Western Jurisdiction, in violation of the Book of Discipline, elected Cedrick D. Bridgeforth as the second married, openly gay Bishop. He was introduced with his husband to great celebration and applause.

All five Jurisdictions passed a resolution clearly targeting Conservatives. The resolution encourages those who may at some point leave the UMC (Conservatives) to voluntarily remove themselves from all committees, boards, and agencies, as well as delegations to General and Jurisdictional Conference. There is no recognition that one can serve faithfully where they are, even if at some point they may choose to serve faithfully somewhere else. Conservatives are expected to leave leadership, while those Progressives and Centrists who are on record as being unwilling to uphold the book of Discipline, are given a pass. This resolution was titled Leading with Integrity. It does not promote real leadership or true integrity.

Each of the Jurisdictions passed a resolution entitled: Queer Delegates Call to Center Justice and Empowerment for LGBTQIA+ People In The UMC. This resolution calls for the Bishops to set aside the legislation passed in 2019 around marriage and ordination. It encourages Bishops to ignore, or resolve without punishment, all those who disobey the Book of Discipline on LGBTQIA+ matters. It also asks that Jurisdictional leadership not pursue complaints against Bishops if they disobey their covenant in these areas alone.

The next resolution that was passed by all five Jurisdictions was titled: Supporting Formation of a US Regional Conference. This is been tried repeatedly by Progressives to disenfranchise the overwhelmingly traditional African vote and to let the majority Progressive United States delegates do what they want on matters of Human Sexuality. It is always presented as a way to not force the Central Conference delegates (those outside the US) to deal with US only matters. In truth, it is thinly veiled racism and colonialism. They are saying, without saying it, since we don't like your views on these things, we will exclude you entirely. The tent is not big enough for those outside the United States.

At the North Central Jurisdiction they had time set aside to hear speeches from an openly gay clergy member, who lamented her lack of full ordination, and a transgender individual whose speech ended with the rallying cry, "...let's queer the church!" This last comment received a standing ovation. They had a training on Christian Nationalism that implied it is possible to be patriotic, but that you may have gone too far if your church has an American flag in the sanctuary, occasionally says the Pledge of Allegiance, believes that we were founded on Christian principles, or honors the 4th of July in church. If any of these apply to you or your church, the Big Tent may just be too small for you.

For those who feel unwelcome in the Big Tent, there is a way to make a change. The process for disaffiliation under paragraph 2553 is currently available, but only for a limited time. The exit flap from the Big Tent is being zipped and padlocked in June. All disaffiliation votes, paperwork, and your payment must be made by May of 2023, so that your church can be considered by the Annual Conference in June. This may seem far off, but it is not. The East Ohio Annual Conference will not address any matters around disaffiliation from November 20th through January 1, 2023. In practice, it has taken up to 6 weeks to get your church disaffiliation payment amount from the conference office. After a Church Council votes to disaffiliate, the District Superintendent has up to 120 days to hold your Church Conference vote. We are thankful for Bishop Malone and the Conference Board of Trustees for not adding any extra requirements to Paragraph 2553. That is not the case in many areas of the church. At present, there is no plan for a special Annual Conference next fall before paragraph 2553 sunsets on December 31, 2023. If you are going to act, please act soon. The clock is ticking.

If you want further information, please look online at the East Ohio Conference website, the process is clearly spelled out. Please also talk to your District Superintendent for their requirements and expectations. You may also consider contacting the East Ohio Wesleyan Covenant Association (EOWCA), (330) 936-8531, email rick.corder@live.com. They have informed leaders who can talk to you or your church about the process. Please know the EOWCA will not speak at any church, nor will it come to any church without being invited by the pastor.

I have been a part of the Methodist church my whole life. I was President of my UMYF in High School. I went to a Methodist College. I have given over 30 years in ministry and service to Christ as a United Methodist pastor. I knew this before, but watching the Jurisdictional Conference, I had to finally make peace in my soul that my Traditional values and understanding have no place in the new UMC. There is no room in the tent for people like me.
