I must admit, technology at time still baffles and amazes me. There are two pictures above, two simple items.... That baffle and amaze me. The first one, on the left is my Kalahari wristband. This past week my family took a vacation, just a few short trips. The first one was an overnight stay to the Kalahari Water Park near Sandusky, and also near Milan, our Church appointment just before moving to Saybrook. Actually we were there when they first broke ground and we visited there at least once before moving back to the Ashtabula area. At that time Kalahari was in its infancy, but it has grown into a huge multi building complex. That's not the part that fascinates me. The part that fascinates me is the wrist band. In my family each of us had a wristband, and it seems as though that wristband had some magical power. It got us into places.... Or at least the little elephant on the wrist band did. You waved it in front of our hotel room door, and the door opened. You waved it in front the

pool area, and you got in, or in front of the locker room area. It let you into places that others without the wristband could not get into. It even allowed us to charge things... up to \$50.... And we did. Just because we had that little wristband. Saybrook Church has something like that now, but not as extensive. On my keychain I have a FOB. It only works on the parking lot door, but it sure is nice, especially on Sunday morning when I get to church early and my hands are full as I enter the building (with breakfast and other stuff), and, at that time of morning, I'm not yet ready to fully unlock the doors, so all I have to do is wave my FOB, and viola, I'm in. The unfortunate thing is, I have gotten a little spoiled and have begun to think.... Now wouldn't it be nice if my FOB opened my office door, or even all the other church doors with just a wave of my hand.

And then it got thinking theologically—of course it did. Easy access, we love it. But what about heaven. Some people love to make it so complicated, but Jesus made it the most simplest thing ever. One of my favorite verses, also referred to as the Bible in miniature is John 3:16: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. That's it in a nutshell. Believe in Him. In the love of the Father and the sacrifice of the Son, and receive it. There are so many that will try to convince you that it is so much more complicated than that, that there are so many other hoops that you have to jump through.... but from the mouth of Jesus Himself, Believe... and if you believe, truly believe, everything else will follow. You see, you can't work your way into heaven. You can't even try to be good enough. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. Ephesians 2:8-9

It's like when you receive Jesus, when you fully believe in him, it's like getting a new wristband that let's you not into some water park, with all those perks, but instead, into the most wonderful place imaginable, and better.

I am still amazed by the technology of my Kalahari wristband.... But even more so by the love God, The Father, and the Son, who provided a FOB to heaven, and the Holy Spirit who daily shows me the way.



MISSION NEWS FROM EL SEMBRADOR

Greetings Earline, Cheryl & Saybrook UMC

I hope this finds you well and the promise of Spring has finally blossomed in your area. We have been following the late departure of winter in much of the U.S.

El Sembrador is so happy to have students back in the physical classrooms and living on campus this year. We are thanking God for being Covid-illness free during the first two months of classes. Students and staff are working hard to follow security guidelines and also teach and learn in a productive way. Everyone I talk to says how glad they are to be back to in person learning. We opened our 5th grade classroom this year and all of our primary grades – Preschool through 5th grade – are learning in the new classrooms built for them through your generosity over the past two years. Between the primary school and the high school, we have over 250 students enrolled at El Sembrador this year.

The residential students keep busy in the afternoons with school work and helping out on some specialized projects around campus. Their evenings are a mix of studies, housekeeping (some personal laundry and room cleaning) and free time. Most evenings include soccer games, table games and hanging out on the porches around their rooms. Their evenings always end with all 37 boys meeting together for devotions and prayer. Many of the devotional times are student-led with each group of roommates working together to share prayer, bible passages and their personal take away from the passage.

In part because of Covid restrictions, we have had to limit the number of students living on campus. We are so thankful for your faithful support of all our students during these past few years. I have been busy getting to know our residential students so that I can share more about them with you. They recently wrote a letter for you which you will be receiving shortly in the mail.

Your previous student chose not to return this year. We continue to pray for what the future has in store for him. I would love to connect you with a new student this year. I am attaching an information card for a student we think would be a great fit for you - I believe you may have spoken with Ethan Batschelet about this student.




