September is upon us already. If we ponder for too long as to where the summer went, before we know it, fall will have passed us by also. As the old saying goes, "Time stands still for no one." When I think about September and of the things that symbolize this month, I easily think of returning to school, Labor Day, Grandparents' Day, and Rally Day for the church. As I sit pondering these four events, the thought has come that in special and unique ways the 4 connect with each other.

Bear with me as I strive to share how I see God's hand at work in our lives. As we all know the start of school means a return to the learning process. For those preschoolers through High School
