Dear Friends,

As we enter into the month of February, images of hearts, cupids, flowers and candy easily come to mind, all connecting with something called **Love**. The question I have for you is "**What is Love?**". The apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 13, declares that an individual can posses any spiritual gift but if it is not accompanied by "**Love**" it is useless. What I understand Paul striving to do here is to give a description of, **Christian Love**. That **love** above all else is the supreme bond. Paul was concerned with spiritual unity and also the quality of our Christian fellowship.

Still the question remains, "What is Love?". The word that Paul used in the original Greek was "Agape". It should be understood that "agape was not the usual word used in Corinth when referring to love, the more common word was "Eros". Love in this use refereed to the sensual or erotic passions. Corinth had the reputation of being one of the most sensual cities of the ancient world, comparable to Las Vegas or Paris France of our present day world.

What Paul was doing was using a new word to convey a new meaning. The word "agape" signifies moral **love**. It conveys the idea of moral **love**, friendship, and good will. There is an element of reverence in it, indicating what man's attitude toward God and his fellow man ought to be. The **love** of which the apostle Paul writes has nothing whatsoever to do with the senses, spiritual qualities or emotions. I believe Paul's goal here was to give **love** a moral and spiritual quality.

As mentioned this "agape" type of **love** which Paul speaks of is not a feeling or emotional type of **love**. Rather it is a type of **love** that Christ showed us, loving us enough to die for us. "Agape" **love** first draws the Christian out of a self-centered

life into one of unity with Christ and fellow believers. Romans 8:38-39 tells us "that nothing in life or death can then separate us from the **love** of God".

In Paul's view, all churches (present day included) can and ought to be regarded first and foremost as a new order of friends. We are different because of the **love** of Christ that reigns within us. Paul's letter in every sense was a essay on Friendship, intended to foster the spirit of Christian friendship. As a spiritual community it is proper if we can be characterized by our spiritual bond, that unites us in faith, loyalty and **love**, first to our Lord and then to one another.

Paul is pleading with the church not to do as he thinks best but rather to fulfil the intention of its founder Jesus Christ, to create an order of friendship as the world has never seen before. What is **Love**? Easier then a definition is a description of its works, John 15:9 "I have loved you even as the father has loved me. "Live within my **love**." An extension to this verse might be, let us **love** one another as Christ has loved us.

Paul was aware of the defects and blemishes of the early church and ancient world just as we are aware of the defects and blemishes of the church and world present day. But unlike the critics both ancient and modern, he refused to stand apart from these poor examples, to give up on them, to quit, rather to keep on loving them just as Jesus did. As Mentioned before "Agape" is a moral kind of love, a love that doesn't give up, a love that is Supreme.

What is **love** then? **Love** is something from God, a very real part of God. As you reread, 1 Corinthians 13 concentrate on verse 8, especially the final part, "**Love** goes on forever".


At the Saybrook UMC
