Oct. 12, 13, 14**


Pastor Vernon & Karen Palo along with Earline & Roy Stiltner will attend the first Annual Conference of the Allegheny West Annual Conference to be held at the Reynoldsburg Methodist Church in Reynoldsburg OH (located on the S.E. side of Columbus.

A Conference report and time of official celebration will be held back at both Saybrook and Plymouth locations.

As of August 9, there were 511 Churches in the Allegheny West Conference with Circuits (Formerly called Districts in the UMC) Our circuit is #8 the Erie Circuit made up of Northeast Ohio and Northwest PA. Also as of August 9 there were 26 churches in the Erie Circuit. Our presiding Elder (formerly called DS or District Superintendents) is the Rev. Duk Hee Han of Correy PA.

In addition to the 1st Annual Conference of the Allegheny West Conference, we are required to have a local conference. This local conference will just be for the Saybrook/Plymouth Charge. The date is Monday October 30 at 6:00 to be held this year in the sanctuary of the Saybrook church.

All groups within each church are encouraged to submit a statement of goals for the coming year. These reports would be appreciated by Tuesday Oct. 24. On a side note this will be the first time in many years that the local Church Conference will not be lumped together with 15-20 other churches. Who should attend this church conference? All are welcome to attend, especially as we are learning about being Global Methodist




NOT JUST A MEMBERSHIP CLASS,






Church Parking Lot Families from both churches are invited to decorate your car trunk, back of your truck or van in some Biblical theme, in addition to handing out treats.

Three fifths of the population is made up of people under the age of 30, with Hindu, Buddhist and Muslim accounting for 95% of the country's religious groups. Only 1.4% of the population are Christian.

John and Vi will be involved in a "Living Waters" ministry this year educating those they will be working with in how to purify their water source along with spreading the Gospel of our Lord and Savior.






